DWANGWA AREA FLOOD IN MALAWI- MARCH 2024 By Tom Logan



Mr. Mwanjikho reports..."The floods, destroyed houses (6,375 households according to government statistics), rendering many homeless. Fields (corn, rice, cassava, and sugar cane) of the affected households and others were either completely wiped out or partly destroyed. Some children as small as one year old were found almost in water without parents. Eight dead bodies were found at the basin of the rivers as of March 5th, and the process of finding lost relatives is still ongoing. Critical among their needs is food to sustain them. Many are still in camps, waiting to find a place to relocate as homes."

In anticipation of funds coming in, MMM authorized the purchase and distribution of maize, blankets, plastic sheets, and pails requested (\$41,786). Mr. Mwanjikho's request will cover only a small

portion of those in need... but through Mr. Mwanjikho we can respond quickly, efficiently, and effectively.

We are still waiting for Mr. Mwanjikho's assessment of the 1600 wells in the area that was flooded. Getting to the wells has been difficult as many of the roads and bridges are gone. Per Mr. Mwanjikho, this is the first time in a 20 year history the area has been heavily flooded.

PALM SUNDAY: First delivery of maize, blankets, plastic sheets, and pails...

The two bridges into the area had yet to be repaired as of Palm Sunday. So, Mr. Khosa and Mr. Langa found a makeshift bridge, hired a lorry to carry 200 110-pound bags of maize (each bag will feed a family of 6 for a month), and loaded two of MMM's pickup trucks with other desperately needed supplies. They then crossed the improvised bridge.

With the help of Mr. Mwanjikho, the needed maize, blankets, plastic sheets, and pails were distributed. When they tried to return the bridge had collapsed. They spent the night and, in the morning, with difficulty, driving through heavy mud they made it back.

REMEMBERING NOBEL PEACE PRIZE WINNER ALBERT SCHWEITZER





After graduating from highschool in 1961, at age 18 I took a solo hitchhiking trek through Africa (Ghana, Cameroun, Gabon, South Africa, Rhodesia, Kenya, Ethiopia). I spent two months with Dr. Albert Schweitzer at his hospital and leper colony in Lambaréné, Gabon.

Albert Schweitzer (14 January 1875 – 4 September 1965) was a theologian, organist, musicologist, author, humanitarian, philosopher, and physician. He received the 1952 Nobel Peace Prize "for his altruism philosophy, "Reverence for Life", and tireless humanitarian work which helped make the idea of brotherhood between men and nations a living one." He used the money from the prize to build the Lambaréné leper colony. Leprosy is a terrifying disease causing severe and disfiguring skin sores and nerve damage commonly resulting in fingers and toes to rot and fall off.

Schweitzer's philosophy was expressed in many ways, but most famously in founding and sustaining the Hospital in Lambaréné, Gabon.

When I met Dr. Schweitzer in 1962, he was 86 years old, yet his spirit of love was a light you could see.

WILLS OR LIVING TRUSTS

A legacy gift can be as simple as one sentence in your will.

(I bequeath \$___ or a %____ of my estate to Legacy of Love.)

You can choose to give a specific amount of money, a specific asset, a percentage of your estate, or even a remainder portion after your expenses are paid and loved ones have been remembered.

Within an estate plan, donors may leave cash, property, stocks or non-cash assets such as life insurance benefits, retirement accounts or securities.

With a Living Trust, your assets can be placed in a "revocable" trust for your benefit during your lifetime, and then transferred to designated beneficiaries at your death by a successor trustee. Because it is "revocable," it has the flexibility to be changed. The benefit is that it might avoid probate and keep your wishes private. State laws apply.

MEMORIAL TRIBUTES

David wanted to provide a memorial tribute to his father. His father believed in self-help and sustainable development. He decided to donate some appreciated securities and requested that the proceeds be used for community and maintenance training for protected water wells. Because he donated appreciated securities, he will not have to pay the capital gains tax on those securities.

BENEFICIARY DESIGNATION

You can designate a beneficiary for your current assets. Assets such as life insurance policies, IRAs, retirement plans, pensions, and bank accounts are distributed based on a beneficiary designation form, not your will. They are transferred directly to your named beneficiaries.

If you wish to name Marion Medical Mission's Legacy of Love as a beneficiary of any of these assets, contact your life insurance provider, retirement plan administrator, and/or bank or financial institution to complete the appropriate beneficiary designation forms which are payable on death (POD).

You must include the legal name of the charity, its address and tax identification number for beneficiary forms.

IRA CHARITABLE ROLLOVER

If you are 70 ½ years or older, you can take advantage of a simple method of directing part of your Individual Retirement Account (IRA) to your favorite qualified charity. You can donate up to \$100,000 annually directly to your charity and it will not be taxed as income to you. This can also be a part of your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) which must be taken annually.

For example: Jane has an IRA account. Being 71 years old, she must take a required minimum distribution of \$23,000 from her IRA account in 2017. Jane contacted her financial advisor and requested that her RMD be paid out directly to the following: \$5,000 to her favorite qualified charity; \$3,000 to her church, and the remaining \$15,000 to her, thus meeting her RMD. Jane made legacy gifts that will be currently put to use and she will be taxed only on the \$15,000 she actually received.

BENEFITS

Planning your estate will help you control your assets during and after your lifetime. When you make simple charitable bequests in your will, you have the flexibility to make changes if your circumstances change. For example, you may choose to designate a specific amount instead of a percentage.

If you own assets naming a beneficiary, your assets should pass directly to the beneficiary without court intervention. You have the flexibility to make changes if by simply changing your beneficiary form.

For example: Tom and Janice chose to designate their cash, real estate, and stocks to their children as beneficiaries. They decided to designate their IRA accounts to their favorite charity as a beneficiary. By doing so, their children will not pay taxes on inherited IRA accounts. They are comfortable knowing that if their wishes change, they can change their beneficiaries.

Your legacy of love will impact the causes and people you care about.

TRUSTS

There are several types of charitable trusts, including:

Charitable Remainder Trusts, Charitable Lead Trusts, and other trusts that can be used for legacy giving.

They may be "irrevocable" which means they cannot be changed.



From Jeff Weill ~ First Time MMM Volunteer

The opportunity to offer clean water to those who have never had it is a gift from God. To be a (small) part of that effort – as the hands and feet of Jesus – is a blessing which will lift your heart for the rest of your life. Substandard Lodging? Awful food? Bugs? Staggeringly awful and dangerous highways? So what! You think St. Paul, squatting in chains in those many jail cells and picking bugs out of his gruel would grouse about those things? He served and glorified Christ! That's what kept him going day after day. And that's what got us pampered American volunteers through the cold bucket showers at our \$6 hotel.

I was surprised by how dangerous driving on the tarmac was, with all the disrepair, bad drivers, and lack of 'rules of the road'. At the same time, and relatedly, God's safety and provision brought us all through without a scratch.

I was also surprised at the degree of poverty we encountered – I'm from rural Mississippi and thought I'd seen the worst, but far from it.

So many aspects of the trip exceeded expectations. God was glorified in the gratitude lifted up at each well, providing fresh water to His children. Meeting the need of these fine people for a near source of clean water, something most have never had, is agreed by all to be a critical and monumental significant priority. When Jesus admonished his followers to 'give a cup of cold water to a child' (Matt. 10:42), he wasn't doing so for the sole purpose of hydration. He wanted his children to know he 'loved them and delivered himself up for them.' (Gal. 2:20).

"At one point I asked Mr. Edwin Nyondo, the Field Officer, where the homeless live in Malawi? Mr. Nyondo didn't know what 'homeless' meant, so I explained it. Mr. Nyondo said to look carefully in each village – no one was homeless. Everyone, even the poorest, was known and taken in by their neighbors." - Jeff Weill
